SPEAKER BIOS

Guillermo “Gil” Witte, M.S. is a Polygraph Examiner for the San Diego Police Department. Gil is also an instructor of PEAK Credibility Assessment Training Center. Gil is a recognized lecturer and instructor, who has spoken and taught at numerous national and international events. For over a decade, Gil has shared his training and expertise with the public, private, and government sectors. Mr. Witte holds a Master’s Degree in Mental Health Counseling. Mr. Witte is a member of the American Polygraph Association (APA), American Association of Police Polygraphists (AAPP), and the California Association of Polygraph Examiners (CAPE).

Rachel Mitchell, JD is the Special Victims Division Chief for the Maricopa County Attorney’s Office in Phoenix, Arizona. She currently supervises the bureaus responsible for prosecuting cases involving child molestation, sexual assault, computer-related crimes against children, child physical abuse, and domestic violence. Rachel teaches prosecutors and other professionals nationally and across Arizona in the areas of crimes against children and adult sexual assault. She also works on legislation for her office. In 2003, Rachel was the Arizona Outstanding Sexual Assault Prosecutor. In 2006, she was the Maricopa County Attorney’s Office Prosecutor of the Year. That same year, she also received the Arizona Children’s Justice Task Force Award for Excellence for Outstanding Child Abuse Legal Professional. In 2013, she was given the David R. White Excellence in Victim Advocacy Award by the Arizona Prosecuting Attorneys’ Advisory Council.

Dr. Tina Garby has a Bachelor’s Degree in Psychology and a Master’s and Doctoral Degree in Clinical Psychology. She is in private practice as a clinical and forensic psychologist. She has worked in the mental health field including with victims of violent and sexual crimes for 28 years and has worked with sex offenders for over 20 years. She conducts evaluations and treatment for sex offenders pre-adjudication and on probation. She has presented at national and international conferences on risk assessments for sex offenders and on Internet sex offenders. She has conducted, published and presented at two APPA’s on vicarious trauma for probation officers working with high risk populations; including sex offenders.
